DAY OF EVENT TIMELINE

STEM Superstar is an opportunity for our local middle school students enrolled in Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses to practice, develop, and demonstrate the knowledge and skills learned through their CTE courses.

Students will spend a fun day getting to know other students from Eastern Washington as they compete for awards and recognition, participate in leadership and hands-on STEM activities, and learn about high school Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSO) opportunities and careers in STEM.

All students have the choice of competing in CO₂ cars and one of the following:

* Graphic Design * Healthcare Practices

* Vex Robotics

Parents and Guardians, please be aware that as we are modeling after our high school CTSO State Conferences, this is a student-only event, and parents/guardians will not be permitted on-site while students are in the competitive preparation portion of the event. You may talk with your student's Advisor if you are interested in volunteering to help with the non-competitive portions of the event. Students will be checked in by Advisors (if on a school bus) or by parents/guardians. We need parents to understand they will be dropping students off but may return at 2:00 p.m. to the check-in table to register for a visitor pass to attend the Award Session.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Your behavior should always be such that it reflects credit to you, your parents, your school, and STEM Superstar. The STEM Superstar event is an extension of area CTE courses, so your conduct at any STEM Superstar event should meet all rules and expectations of good behavior specified by your school district and STEM Superstar. Thus, all school rules/policies are also in effect, and anyone found violating these rules/guidelines will be dealt with accordingly. If, at any time, student behavior does not meet expectations, the STEM Superstar Committee will have the final determination on the outcome of the situation. We expect this to be a fun and engaging day for all and look forward to spending the day together.

Student conduct is the responsibility of the local advisor.

- Students will always keep their advisors informed of their activities and whereabouts.
- Students will immediately report accidents, injuries, or illnesses to their advisor.
- Students will attend all sessions, competitive events, and activities assigned. Please be prompt and show respect to others.
- Students will always wear their STEM Superstar name badges during conferences.
- Students will be given their STEM Superstar T-shirt at check-in to wear during the conference.
- Students will not use AI resources to develop any part of their competitive event entry or for testing purposes. Entries will be submitted to various tools and resources to check for AI usage. Immediate disqualification will result.
- Students will not enter any competition preparation room to which they are not assigned unless they have specific permission from STEM Superstar Conference Management.
- Students will not roughhouse, wrestle, tickle, give piggyback rides, backrubs, or massages, sit on another student's lap, hit, kick, pinch, push, or participate in any other physical contact with another student.
- Students will not make racial, ethnic, gender, sexual, or related comments or slurs intended to impact another student or adult.
- Students will not purchase, consume, possess, or be under the influence of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, electronic cigarettes (e-cig or e-cigarette), personal vaporizers (PV), electronic nicotine delivery systems, or marijuana products or paraphernalia at any time.
- Students will not steal, vandalize, or cause other damage to the facility or another student's possessions.
- Students will only leave the conference site with permission from their advisor.

Students who disregard these rules may be subject to disciplinary actions and may not be allowed to participate in STEM Superstar for the remainder of the school year and possibly a more extended amount of time, in addition to school disciplinary action. Finally, event organizers will call the police for egregious violations.
